### IV. Translate from English to Chinese. (30 points)

These examples illustrate the ideological basis of criteria for language cultivation. Those people who favor the old will oppose the introduction of novel cultural items of any kind, and even more the introduction of new names for them. The linguistic purist is normally conservative in other matters as well: in clothing, in food, in institutions and in technology. The only way to defend oneself against the diffusion of innovation is to build a physically or ideologically closed community, in the way that certain religious and ideological sects have tried to do. The Amish (阿曼门诺派教徒) tried to keep electricity, engines and external education out of their lives, and to the extent that they succeeded were presumably able to avoid serious demands for new terminology. These, however, are the exceptions: more generally, with growing forces of globalization, very few societies have not been forced to accept technological, economic, cultural and, consequently, linguistic innovation.

Ensuring that linguistic innovation is controlled and does not introduce foreign words is a small but satisfying step to the traditionalists. Just as banning obscene language provides at least a surface appearance of chaste behavior, so avoiding foreign loan words makes it seem as though all is well. Underlying purism is an understandable but ultimately harmful belief in the superiority of one's own tradition, nation, religion or ethnic group: understandable, because without it, one is cast adrift in a valueless system; harmful, whenever it is translated into action to cleanse one's society of otherness. The path from linguistic purity to ethnic cleansing may not be inevitable, but it is regrettably only too common.

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
